From Camp to Commissioner: *Nowshad's* Inspiring Journey

Md. Nowshad Alam, raised in a marginalized camp in Alamnagar, Rangpur, became an Assistant Commissioner through the 41st BCS. Despite poverty, his parents valued education. With support from Mr. Anwar Khan and OBAT Helpers, he excelled academically—ranking 2nd in the Rangpur Zilla School entrance, scoring GPA 5.00 in SSC & HSC, and securing top admission to Dhaka University. Now serving the nation as top ranked civil servant in Bangladesh, Nowshad's journey shows how education and support can turn struggle into success. He remains grateful to all who believed in him.



From Bogra to Beijing: *Ashiq's Journey with OBAT*



Ashiq, the youngest in his family, joined OBAT's tutorial center in 2018 and excelled in academics, earning a GPA of 4.93 in SSC and leading the OBAT Think Tank. While studying Mechanical Engineering, he actively supported community service through OBAT. With limited financial means, his dream of studying Industrial Robotics in China became a reality with OBAT's support. He also gained valuable digital skills at the OBAT IT Center. Ashiq proudly credits OBAT for turning his dream into reality.

From Jahangirnagar to Japan – *Monika's Journey of Inspiration*

Monika Akhter, now a MEXT scholar pursuing a PhD in Global Environmental Management at Hokkaido University, Japan, overcame a major challenge during her M.Sc. at Jahangirnagar University when she lacked a laptop for her thesis. OBAT Helpers stepped in with timely support, enabling her to complete her research and attend national and international conferences. Her presentation at the Nagao Environment Foundation (NEF) workshop earned first prize. Today, Monika continues to thrive globally—and now gives back by supporting OBAT.



At OBAT Helpers, we believe empowering women with skills is the first step to uplifting entire communities. Our 7 Women Empowerment Sewing Centers have trained 265 women, giving them not just vocational skills, but also the confidence to become income earners and leaders in their families.

These centers have helped over 265 beneficiaries—from learning how to sew to taking bulk stitching orders from local organizations. Graduates go on to work in tailoring shops, start home-based businesses, or join the garment industry.

Reshma's Rise to Self-Reliance



Reshma, a resilient widow from Baitul Falah Camp, has spent most of her life battling hardship to raise her two daughters. After losing her husband, she worked tirelessly, first making paper bags, then taking a job at a fish processing company. Yet, no matter how hard she worked, her income barely covered the basics.

Refusing to let poverty define her daughters' future, Reshma took a bold step in 2012 and enrolled in OBAT Helpers' sewing course.

With dedication and the skills she gained, along with the encouragement and support from OBAT, she started her own tailoring business. What began with a single sewing machine soon grew into a small shop of her own.



Today, Reshma earns a stable income and is able to provide her daughters with a better life. Her journey from daily struggle to self-reliance is a testament to how opportunity and support can empower women to rise above their circumstances and rebuild their lives with dignity.

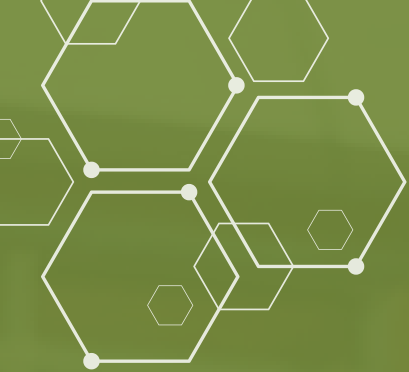
Mahbuba's Rise: Future Software Engineer from

In 2024, OBAT's healthcare programs provided critical services to those most in need. Over 6,000 patients received treatment through our clinics, while 432 critical cases were supported with life-saving care. We restored vision to 127 individuals through cataract surgeries and supported 117 mothers with safe maternity services.

Our Special Kid Care Center offered specialized care to 51 children, helping them grow with confidence and dignity.

A Story of Hope: **Roshida's** Journey with OBAT Health Care Center

In the heart of Alamnagar, Rangpur, 40-year-old Roshida was silently battling diabetes, high blood pressure, and the toll of a major surgery. Weak and unable to afford proper treatment, her future seemed uncertain—until she arrived at OBAT Health Care Center.



On her first visit, doctors found her blood sugar at a dangerously high 27.6 mmol/L. OBAT responded swiftly—with free treatment, compassionate care, and essential health education.

Guided through lifestyle changes and regular follow-ups, Roshida began to regain control of her health.



A month later, her sugar level dropped to 11.0 mmol/L. She felt stronger, more stable, and filled with new hope. OBAT continued to support her recovery with nerve-strengthening care and close monitoring.

At OBAT, healthcare means more than medicine—it means restoring dignity and rewriting stories of resilience.

A Story of Hope: Mumtaz-Nishat Special Kids Center, Chittagong

OBAT Helpers launched its Special Kid Care Center in 2020 with support from Think Tank and one of our esteemed donor Rizwan Samad, starting with 24 children. Today, the center serves 29 children with various disabilities including speech, hearing, intellectual, and physical challenges.



Children received therapy at Chittagong's Mother and Child Hospital, with six on continuous medication. Those with ENT issues were treated at SAHIC Sub Center, which continues to aid in their development.



Thanks to consistent care, many children have shown remarkable improvement. The center also organizes drawing, sports, and basic education—currently, 14 children are receiving foundational education, with 8 enrolled in formal schools.

Families are grateful for the care, progress, and hope brought by OBAT's autism initiative.

Jamila's Strength: How Small Support Brings Big Hope

Jamila, a long-time resident of Geneva Camp, Dhaka has endured a lifetime of hardship and adversity. After losing her husband many years ago, she was left to care for her daughter alone—both mother and daughter living with mental health challenges. With no source of income and age gradually limiting her ability to manage daily tasks, Jamila's situation has grown increasingly fragile.

Yet, despite the overwhelming uncertainty that surrounds her, Jamila remains resilient, holding on to hope with quiet strength.

Thanks to OBAT Helpers' Family Assistance Program, Jamila now receives 1,000 BDT (10 USD) each month. While modest, this support brings a sense of dignity and relief—allowing her to afford essentials that were once out of reach.

It not only eases her immediate burdens but also restores a sense of stability to her otherwise precarious life.

Jamila's story reflects the reality of countless vulnerable families living in extreme poverty. It is also a powerful reminder that consistent, even small-scale support, can bring real, lasting impact—helping individuals reclaim their dignity and rebuild their lives, one step at a time.

Most days, she struggles to provide even a basic meal, often depending on the goodwill of compassionate neighbors.



Rousan's Story – Strengthening Families through Monthly Support



Rousan lives in Geneva Camp, Dhaka, with her family of four. Her son, the sole breadwinner, makes and sells handmade clothing items. However, the low demand and limited income from this work make it difficult for the family to meet their basic needs.

To ease their burden, Rousan receives monthly support of 1,000 BDT (10 USD) through OBAT's Family Assistance Program. This provides much-needed relief, helping cover essential expenses and maintain stability during hard times.

Support like this ensures families like Rousan's are not left behind, even when income sources falter.

A Rare Joy on Eid-al-Adha An Impact Story of Afsary

Afsary is a physically challenged child living with her family in Muslim Camp, Mirpur 11, Dhaka. Her father is the sole breadwinner, working in the handicraft sector to support their family of four. Despite his efforts, the family struggles to afford even basic necessities.



Due to financial hardship, Afsary and her family cannot afford meat throughout the year. Through OBAT's Eid-ul-Azha Qurbani Program, they received 4 kilograms of meat on Eid. This generous gift brought joy and nourishment to a family that rarely experiences such blessings. For Afsary and many children, this act of sharing made Eid truly special.

When floods struck Feni and Rangpur region, OBAT Helpers quickly stepped in to support the affected families. Emergency relief was delivered to 300 families in Feni and 200 in Rangpur, including food, clean water, and essentials.

To address health concerns, a medical camp in Feni provided care to 2,966 individuals.

Altogether, 3,466 people were supported—receiving not only aid but the comfort of knowing they were not alone during crisis.

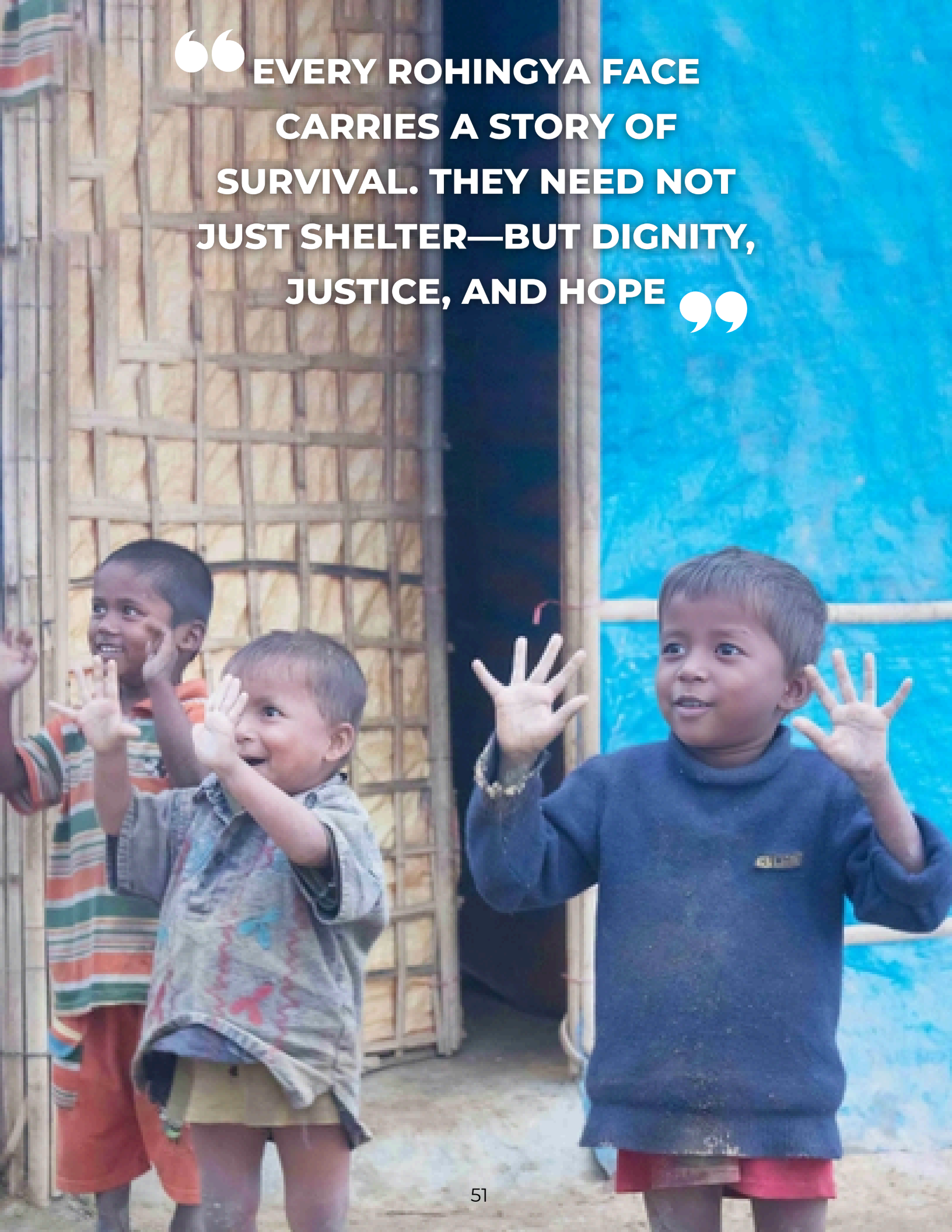

EMPOWERING EDUCATION FOR ROHINGYA CHILDREN

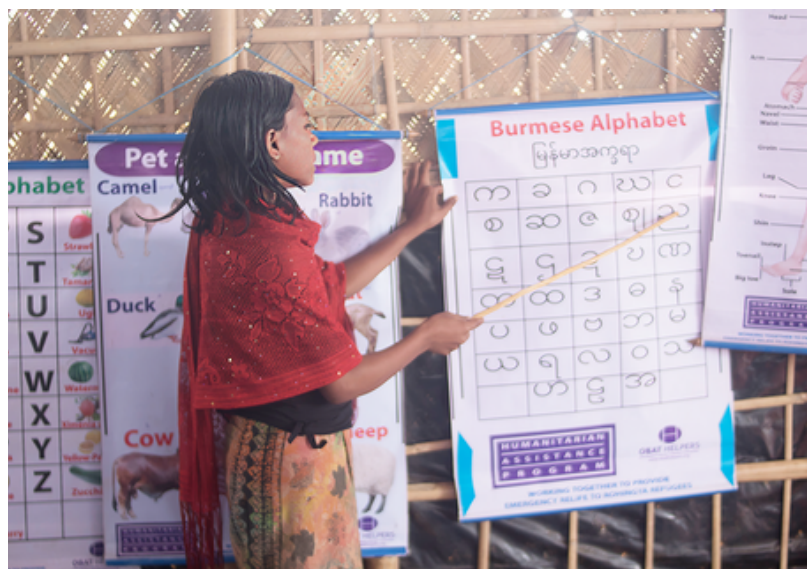


At OBAT Helpers, our eight Learning Centers (LC 01 to LC 08) are transforming lives through inclusive, community-based education for Rohingya refugee children. Over the reporting period, a total of 640 children were enrolled across all centers — 337 girls and 303 boys, including 8 children with disabilities (CWD). Each center serves 80 learners divided into two shifts, ensuring accessibility and manageable class sizes.

The students, ranging from Grade 1 to Grade 3, attend classes in morning and afternoon shifts designed to accommodate the needs of each community. Through this structured approach, **OBAT's Learning Centers** not only deliver academic knowledge but also offer a safe, nurturing environment for children who have experienced immense hardship.

This initiative reflects our continued commitment to inclusive, equitable, and quality education—bringing hope, dignity, and opportunity to every child, no matter their background.





HEALTH PROGRAM FOR ROHINGYA

Access to healthcare remains vital for the Rohingya refugees. Over 13,700 individuals received outpatient checkups, while 3,800 respiratory infections and 663 diarrhea cases were treated. Additionally, 1,609 cases of skin disease and 646 non-communicable diseases were managed. Dental care reached 663 patients.

These efforts reflect our continued commitment to safeguarding the health and dignity of this vulnerable community.

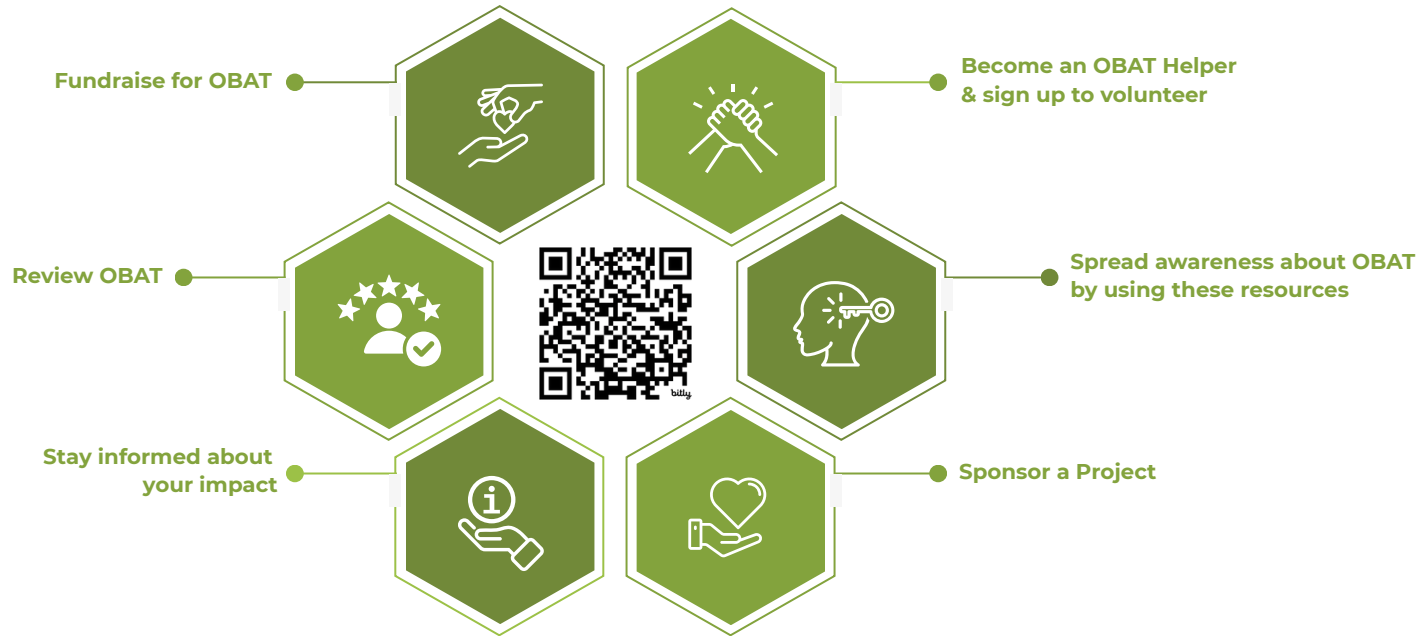
